STATE EVICTION PROTECTIONS CHANGED APRIL 1, 2022

Some protections continue for tenants with rent relief applications submitted by March 31, 2022

STEP 1

Pay your monthly rent on time, starting April 1. If you are unable to pay rent, contact the Homelessness Prevention System at preventhomelessness.org or 408-926-8885.

STEP 2

Do not move out without learning about your rights, protections and options. Reach out to the County of Santa Clara for more information at **sccrenthelp.org** or **408-808-7770**.

STEP 3

State rent relief applications received before April 1 are still being processed. For help checking the status of your application, visit sccrenthelp.org or 408-808-7770.

DID YOU GET COURT OR LEGAL PAPERS?

STEP 1: ACT FAST!

You must file papers with the Court within 5 business days. If you don't file a response in 5 business days, a tenant may be evicted without having a say in the case.
