

+\$315M: HCD's Multifamily Housing Program

+\$260M: REAP 2.0 - City Planning Grants

+\$500M: Enhanced State Housing Tax Credit

+\$14M: Housing Navigation for Foster Youth

+\$1 Billion: Homeless Housing, Assistance &

Prevention

+\$250M: Encampment Resolution

-\$10M: MHP

-\$40M: REAP 2.0

-\$127.5M: Adaptive Reuse Program

-\$235M: HCD's Infill Infrastructure Grant

-\$76M: Veterans (VHPP)

2024 Budget and Bonds

- In parallel: Bonds for the November ballot are discussed along with the budget
- Needs robust support: A bond needs support from the Democratic caucus in each house and the Governor's office
- Limited by bonding capacity: Organized support for climate, schools, and housing all vied for the state's limited capacity
- Traded for budget allocations: Ultimately, climate and schools prevailed.
